APPOINTMENT OF A PRIVATE WAREHOUSE (Customs Act, Chap. 78:01)

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred upon the Comptroller of Customs and Excise under the Customs Act, Chap. 78:01, I, Kawanhar Doopan, Comptroller of Customs and Excise, acting under the provisions of sections 2 and 263(2) of the said Act, do hereby appoint the place specified in the Schedule hereto to be a Private/Customs Area for the storage of machinery, equipment, raw materials, semi-manufactured goods and other ingredients imported or taken out of bond by Tri Fish Ice and Cold Storage Ltd. for the processing of salted fish or other goods as may subsequently be approved.

SCHEDULE

A one (1) story building situate at Lot No. 4A, Road Reserve, Macoya Industrial Estate, Macoya, Tunapuna.

The building is a concrete and steel structure with galvanized iron roofing and external steel doors and measures 24.4 metres x 18.3 metres comprising an area of 446.5 sq. metres.
