INDEX OF RETAIL PRICES - JUNE, 2000

General Index

The All items Index of Retail Prices calculated from prices collected for the month of June, 2000 was 133.8 showing a decrease of 0.2% below the Index for May, 2000.

The All items Index for January-June, 2000 showed an increase of 3.2% over that for January-June, 1999. This compares with an increase of 4.7% observed in the Index for January-June, 1999 over the similar period in 1998.

Section Indices

Food: The index for this section decreased from 213.0 in May, 2000 to 211.8 in June, 2000 showing a decrease of 0.6%. Within the Food Section there were decreases of 0.2% and 1.0% in the Index for non-market and markets items respectively. Contributing significantly to this decrease were falling prices of chicken, tomatoes and carrots. These price decreases were offset by an increase in the prices of citrus fruits and Irish potatoes.

The effect of price changes in this section on the All Items Index was -0.3 point.

Other Sections

A further review of the data for June, 2000 indicated marginal increases of 0.1% for Drink and Tobacco and Health and Personal care respectively. A slight decrease of 0.1% was observed for prices of clothing and footwear.

The price changes, in the above sections had a negligible effect on the All Items Index.

Growth in consumer prices in June, 2000 compared with those of June, 1999 reflected in various sections of the Index is shown hereunder:-
