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## INDEX OF RETAIL PRICES - JULY, 2000

### General Index

The All Items Index of Retail Prices calculated from prices collected for the month of July, 2000 was 133.8 showing no change over the Index for July, 2000.

The All Items Index for January-July, 2000 showed an increase of 3.2% over that for January-July, 1999. This compares with an increase of 4.3% in the Index for January-July, 1999 over the similar period in 1998.

### **Section Indices**

Food: The Index for this section decreased from 211.8 in June, 2000 to 209.0 in July, 2000 showing a decrease of 1.3%. Within the Food Section there was a decrease of 3.1% in the Index for Market items. Contributing significantly to this decrease were falling prices of chicken, tomatoes and fresh fish. These price decreases were offset by an increase in the prices of citrus fruits and pumpkin.

The effect of price changes in this section on the All Items Index was 0.6 point.

### **Other Sections**

A further review of the data for July, 2000 indicated that increases were recorded for the following: Housing, 0.2%; Health and Personal Care, 0.8%; Transportation, 2.6%; and Reading, Recreation and Education, 2.1%. Decreases were recorded for the following: Meals out 0.3%; Clothing and Footwear, 0.4% and Household Supplies and Services 1.5% respectively.

The effect of price changes, in these sections on the Index was 0.6 point.

Growth in consumer prices in July, 2000 compared with those of July, 1999 reflected in various sections of the Index is shown hereunder:-
