INDEX OF RETAIL PRICES - OCTOBER, 2000

General Index

The All Items Index of Retail Prices calculated from prices collected for the month of October, 2000 was 136.8 showing an increase of 1.0% over the Index for September, 2000.

The All Items Index for January-October, 2000 showed an increase of 3.3% over that for January-October, 1999. This compares with an increase of 3.5% observed in the Index for January-October, 1999 over the similar period in 1998.

Section Indices

Food: The Index for this section increased from 217.1 in September, 2000 to 221.3 in October, 2000 showing an increase of 1.9%. Within the Food Section there was an increase of 4.7% in the Index for Market items. Contributing significantly to this increase were rising prices of chicken, fresh fish, tomatoes and melongene. These price increases were offset by decreases in the prices of citrus fruits and irish potatoes.

Price changes in this section accounted for an increase of 0.9 point in the All Items Index.

Other Sections

A further review of the data for October, 2000 indicated that the following increases were recorded: Meals Out 0.2%; Household Supplies and Services 0.3%; Health and Personal care, 0.5%; Transportation, 0.2%; and Recreation, Reading, Education 3.7%. These increases were offset by decreases in Clothing and Footwear, 0.1%; and Rent, 0.1%.

Price changes in these sections accounted for an increase of 0.4 point in the All Items Index.

Growth in consumer prices in October, 2000 compared with those of October, 1999 reflected in various sections of the Index is shown hereunder:-
