INDEX OF RETAIL PRICES - APRIL, 2000

General Index

The All items Index of Retail Prices calculated from prices collected for the month of April, 2000 was 133.4 showing an increase of 1.3 points or 1.0% over the Index for March, 2000

The All items Index for January-April, 2000 showed an increase of 3.1% over that from January-April, 1999. This compares with an increase of 5.5% observed in the Index for January-April, 1999 over the similar period in 1998.

Section Indices

Food: The index for this section increased from 204.4 in March, 2000 to 210.0 in April, 2000 showing an increase of 2.7%. Within the Food Section there was a marginal increase of 0.1% in the Index for non-market items, while market items increased by 6.5%. Contributing significantly to this increase were rising prices of tomatoes, citrus fruits and cabbage.

The effect of price changes in this section on the All items Index was 1.2 points.

Other Sections

A further review of the data for April, 2000 indicated that increases were recorded for the following: Drink and Tobacco, 0.2%; Rent 0.1%; Household Supplies and Services, 0.1%; Health and Personal care, 0.8%; Transportation, 0.2% and Reading, Recreation, Education 0.2%. A slight decrease was recorded for clothing and Footwear.

The effect of price changes, in these sections on the Index was 0.1 point.

Growth in consumer prices in April, 2000 compared with those of April, 1999 reflected in various sections of the Index is shown hereunder:-
