PUBLIC NOTICE

2026 Updated Public Statement

of the

OFFICE OF THE ATTORNEY GENERAL

In compliance with sections 7, 8, and 9 of
The Freedom of Information Act, 1999

Under the Freedom of Information Act 1999 ("the FOIA"), each public authority is required to publish and update certain information for the benefit of the public. This includes the structure and function of each public authority, a list of categories of documents held by the authority, and the process for obtaining documents. The statement also identifies those documents that are generally available for public scrutiny and purchase.

THE FOLLOWING INFORMATION IS PUBLISHED BY THE OFFICE OF THE ATTORNEY GENERAL.

The FOIA gives members of the public:

1. A legal right for each person to access information held by the Office of the Attorney General;
2. A legal right for each person to have official information relating to himself/herself amended where it is incomplete, incorrect or misleading;
3. A legal right to obtain reasons for adverse decisions made regarding an applicant's request for information under the FOIA; and
4. A legal right to complain to the Ombudsman and to apply to the High Court for Judicial Review to challenge adverse decisions made under the FOIA.

SECTION 7 STATEMENT

SECTION 7(1)(a)(i) - Function and Structure of the Office of the Attorney General

FUNCTION

The mandate of the Office of the Attorney General (hereinafter referred to as "the OAG") is to provide comprehensive and efficient legal services to the Government of the Republic of Trinidad and Tobago, the private sector, various agencies, regional and international institutions, and members of the public.

The OAG's obligations are primarily derived from the constitutional directives given to the Attorney General.

These include:

- Responsibility for the administration of legal affairs in Trinidad and Tobago;
- To represent the State in civil proceedings, in the name of the Attorney General' and
- To act as an independent guardian of the public interest, and to ensure that the rights of all citizens are protected.

ORGANIZATIONAL STRUCTURE AND STAFFING

The OAG is headed by the Honourable Attorney General, the Permanent Secretary, and two (2) Deputy Permanent Secretaries. The OAG is staffed by Directors of Units/Departments, contract employees and public officers on the Establishment. The contract positions comprise clerical, technical/professional, secretarial, administrative and manipulative staff. The OAG is divided into the Departments/Units listed below. Additionally, an extract from Extraordinary Gazettes Vol. 64 No. 146, dated Saturday October 04th, 2025 and Vol. 64 No. 147, dated Sunday October 05th, 2025 listing the Business and Departments of Government and Statutory Boards and Other Bodies which are under the remit of the OAG is detailed below.

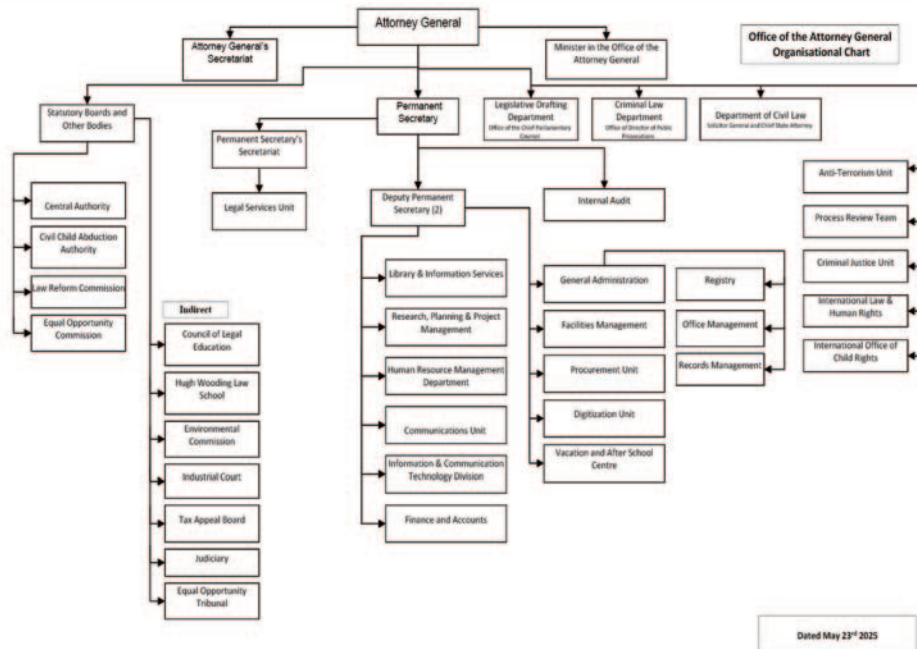

FUNCTIONS OF THE UNITS/DEPARTMENTS OF THE OFFICE OF THE ATTORNEY GENERAL

Department of Civil Law

By virtue of the Judicial and Legal Service Act, Chap 6:01 as amended by Act No. 14 of 2024 ("the Act"), the offices of the Solicitor General and the Chief State Solicitor were fused and renamed the Department of Civil Law. As such, all law officers within the Department of Civil Law work under the same framework and the Solicitor General is the Head of Department.

The Department of Civil Law performs a critical role in the administration of justice and provides legal services to all Government Ministries and Departments, as well as to the members of the public. The Department of Civil Law advises the State on all aspects of Civil Law, represents the State in both Constitutional and Civil Proceedings, assists in the formulation and execution of Government policy within the limits of the law and vets financial documents related to loan agreements and bond issues on the domestic and international markets.

Further, the Department of Civil Law provides commercial and property law services to both the Government and the public, including the preparation of deeds and contracts for commercial enterprises and for the engagement of consultants and other personnel.

Criminal Law Department

The Office of the Director of Public Prosecutions ("the Criminal Law Department") is headed by the Director of Public Prosecutions. This Office was created by the Constitution of the Republic of Trinidad and Tobago. It is independent of both political and stakeholder involvement.

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The functions of the Criminal Law Department include the following:

- Undertaking criminal prosecutions in all High Courts (Assizes and Appeal).
- Briefing Counsel in the United Kingdom on the conduct of appeals before the Judicial Committee of the Privy Council.
- Undertaking prosecutions in complex matters and matters of public interest in the forty (40) Magistrates' Courts throughout the country.
- Formulating prosecution policy.
- Interfacing on a regular basis with governmental, non-governmental and international agencies such as the Police, Defence Force, Customs and Excise, Board of Inland Revenue and Town and Country Planning Division. In addition, there is a great deal of interaction with the public, the United States Department of Justice, the Crown Prosecution Service and other prosecuting agencies within the Caribbean Territories.
- Assisting with extradition requests.
- Proffering indictments before the High Court and preparing and filing other legal documents.

Legislative Drafting Department

The Office of the Chief Parliamentary Counsel ("the Office") is the only constitutionally recognised provider of professional legislative drafting services for the Legislative Arm of the State (i.e., Parliament). The drafting of legislation is generally initiated upon the written instructions by the Executive Arm of the State (i.e., Cabinet) which, in accordance with section 75(1) of the Constitution, is collectively responsible to Parliament for Government's legislative policy. The primary purpose of the Office is to translate Government's policy into sound legislation.

Government's policy is evidenced by a decision of the Cabinet contained in a Cabinet Minute, which becomes the Office's instructions to draft.

The main functions of Parliamentary Counsel are –

1. drafting legislation, namely Bills, regulations, rules, orders, by-laws, proclamations and notices;
2. preparing briefs on drafted legislation including relevant research;
3. consolidating the particular law to its extant state prior to making any amendments in order to facilitate its legislative passage; construing and interpreting policy instructions or statements;
4. vetting draft legislation prepared by the Law Reform Commission; finalising draft legislation prepared by consultants on the basis of Cabinet-approved policy instructions;
5. attending Parliament during the debate and passage of Bills to advise the Attorney General and Line Ministers on any drafting and legal issues which are raised;
6. drafting amendments required during the Committee Stage of the passage of a Bill in Parliament;
7. advising the Attorney General and Line Ministers on the legal and constitutional implications of questions raised and amendments proposed during the passage of a Bill in Parliament.
8. drafting amendments required during the Committee Stage of the passage of a Bill in Parliament;
9. advising the Attorney General and Line Ministers on the legal and constitutional implications of questions raised and amendments proposed during the passage of a Bill in Parliament.

Criminal Justice Unit

The Criminal Justice Unit (CJU) is responsible for transforming the criminal justice system to reflect Constitutional ideals, Government policies and international best practices/trends. The ultimate objective is to achieve greater efficiency and fairness to all users of the justice system, including the public.

This encompasses multifaceted responsibilities involving:

- Advising and liaising with the Attorney General and other Government Ministries;
- Ongoing liaison with criminal justice entities such as the Judiciary, the Prisons, the DPP's Office, the Law Association, the Public Defenders Department, the Police Service, the Forensic Science Centre, the Ministry of Homeland Security, the Anti-Corruption Investigation Bureau, and the Strategic Services Agency;
- Meeting and co-ordinating with international partners including the US Embassy, the British High Commission, the UNDP and the Commonwealth, to secure funding and partner on justice projects;
- Consulting with key stakeholders and members of the public on policy and legislative proposals relating to the four key reform areas of plant and machinery, people, process and laws of the justice system;





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- Conducting comprehensive legal research, preparing preliminary advice, preparing policies and liaising with legislative drafters on the development of legislation;
- Attending meetings with the Legislation Review Committee (LRC) and Parliament in order to advise the Attorney General during debates;
- Preparing Parliamentary Briefs for the Attorney General or relevant Minister(s); and
- Ensuring the operationalisation, sensitisation and monitoring of new legislation in the justice system.

Anti-Terrorism Unit

The primary function of the Anti-Terrorism Unit (ATU) is to fulfil the obligation of the Attorney General under the Anti-Terrorism Act, Chap. 12:07. Primarily, the ATU makes applications to the High Court for the designation of individuals and entities, both domestically and as listed on various United Nations Sanctions Lists. It also makes applications for Targeted Financial Sanctions. Further, the ATU works closely with key national agencies relative to counter-terrorism matters, as well as with international stakeholders.

Vital to the role of the ATU and the fulfilment of the country's obligations are the international standards in respect of terrorism imposed on Trinidad and Tobago as a member state of both the United Nations and Caribbean Financial Action Task Force (CFATF). In the execution of its obligations, the ATU works closely with both the CFATF and Financial Action Task Force.

Attorney General's Secretariat

The Secretariat operates under the sole direction and instruction of the Attorney General.

Its core functions are:

- To liaise with foreign Attorneys on litigation matters involving the State of Trinidad and Tobago;
- To assist the Attorney General with day-to-day administrative and procedural functions;
- To provide legal advice on an extensive range of legal matters that are submitted to the Office from other Ministries/Departments, Cabinet and Statutory bodies which includes constitutional and civil issues, commercial matters, municipal and international law, legislative matters before Cabinet and Parliament, and matters of law reform;
- To draft Instruments of Appointment for Members of various Boards and to draft complex legal documents;
- To assist in the review of Financial Documents as submitted by the Ministry of Finance for positive vetting by the Attorney General; and
- To assist in the review of agreements/contracts submitted by the Ministry of Energy and Energy Industries for positive vetting by the Attorney General.

International Office of Child Rights

The International Office of Child Rights (IOCR) maintains our country's obligations under The Hague Convention on the Civil Aspects of International Child Abduction and ensures that children are returned to their country of habitual residence. It also houses the Civil Child Abduction Authority (CCAA), which was established under the International Child Abduction Act, 2008. This Act provides for the application of The Hague Convention to the Civil Aspects of International Child Abduction in Trinidad and Tobago and provides for matters connected with or related thereto.

The CCAA is a Central Authority established to deal with all matters relating to the civil aspects of international parental child abduction between Trinidad and Tobago and contracting territories. To date, Trinidad and Tobago has partnered with over fifty (50) territories under The Hague Convention. The CCAAs also responsible for discharging the duties which are imposed by the Convention.

International Law and Human Rights Unit

The International Law and Human Rights Unit (ILHRU) primarily focuses on the preparation of country reports for submission to various international organisations in relation to International Human Rights instruments of which Trinidad and Tobago is a party. The Unit also acts as a peer reviewer for other countries when a request is made to the government from an international organisation, such as the United Nations. Further, the ILHRU forms part of national task forces which are charged with Trinidad and Tobago's national policy and legislation in relation to human trafficking, refugees and asylum seekers. It sits as one of the government's representatives on the ILO 144 Tripartite Committee in the Ministry of Labour, Small and Micro Enterprise Development as well as the Cabinet-appointed Committee for implementation of the Convention on the Rights of Persons with Disabilities. When necessary, the ILHRU also engages in public awareness campaigns on various human rights issues as well as the hosting of international conferences and meetings which relate to human rights matters.





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Process Review Team

The Process Review Team is tasked with enhancing the organisational effectiveness of the OAG's policies, management systems and practices by addressing deficiencies in respect of work distribution and workflows, tracking and monitoring systems and evaluation and feedback mechanisms within the OAG. It supports the work of the Attorney General by ensuring the development of a Legislative Agenda and engages in intervention strategies to expedite critical legal matters under the purview of the Department of Civil Law, Law Reform Commission and Legislative Drafting Department.

The Team's core objectives are to assist the Attorney General in the execution of specified matters as determined from the Legislative Agenda and to provide advice on legislative and policy reform.

Human Resource Management Unit

This Unit is responsible for the management of the OAG's human capital in an effective, fair, and consistent manner so as to achieve the OAG's strategic goals and objectives. The functions include recruitment, human resource planning, training and development, performance evaluation management, development of human resource management policies, industrial and employee relations and compensation.

General Administration

This Unit provides essential support services to the OAG through office management and registry functions.

- **Office Management:** Responsible for procuring goods and services to ensure the efficient operation of the Ministry.
- **Registry:** Maintains and securely stores all records generated within the Ministry, ensuring business continuity and compliance with legal requirements.
- **Records Management:** To ensure that all records within the Ministry are properly organised, protected, and accessible to support efficient operations.

Research, Planning and Project Management

The Research, Planning and Project Management supports the development and execution of the OAG's policies, programmes, and projects in alignment with the Government's mandate.

Key responsibilities include:

- Assisting in the formulation and implementation of policies, programmes, and projects;
- Monitoring the budgetary requirements of all Departments and Units within the OAG;
- Overseeing the implementation of the Public Sector Investment Programme (PSIP);
- Preparing the OAG's annual budgets (primarily capital expenditure); and
- Providing data, analysis, and advice on ongoing projects to the Attorney General, Minister in the OAG, and Permanent Secretary.

Finance and Accounts Unit

The Finance and Accounts Unit is responsible for the following core functions:

- Processing the OAG's payroll;
- Processing payments to all suppliers of goods and services;
- Processing payments to the OAG's Agencies for their operational and capital projects; and
- Preparing statutory and other financial reports for submission to the Ministry of Finance, the Comptroller of Accounts, and the Auditor General.

Information and Communications Technology (ICT) Division

The ICT Division manages the OAG's information technology platform, enabling real-time information sharing among the OAG, its agencies, staff, and stakeholders.





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The Division delivers services in the following key areas:

- **Systems analysis:** Analysing the business needs of the OAG and its agencies to identify challenges and recommend appropriate solutions;
- **Systems development:** Designing, developing, and maintaining new applications;
- **Systems installation:** Installing, maintaining, and monitoring the OAG's computer network, including all related hardware and software;
- **Systems administration:** Implementing, training users on, and documenting new systems and applications.

Facilities Management Unit

The Facilities Management Unit is responsible for the ongoing planning, monitoring, rehabilitation, and capital replacement of all buildings under the OAG's purview.

This encompasses:

- The physical structure of the buildings;
- All building services and equipment;
- The internal layout (including offices, rooms, facilities, major office equipment, and electrical/mechanical systems); and
- The external premises, including pavements, landscaping, and all exterior attachments.

Procurement Unit

The Procurement Unit manages the acquisition of consultants, contractors, goods, and services. It oversees the issuance and administration of contracts while ensuring that every stage of the procurement process upholds the highest standards of integrity, transparency, and professionalism.

Communications Unit

The Corporate Communications Unit creates, implements, and manages all internal and external communication programmes aimed at increasing awareness of the OAG's mandate and the activities undertaken to fulfil it.

Key responsibilities include:

- Strategic communication planning;
- Reputation management;
- Image and branding;
- Media relations;
- Digital media management;
- Event planning and management;
- Protocol services;
- Stakeholder engagement; and
- Internal communications.

Internal Audit Unit

The Internal Audit Unit ensures full implementation and compliance with the government's accounting systems and standards prescribed by the Ministry of Finance. This includes verifying that all accounting records of the OAG are complete, accurate, up-to-date, and properly secured.

Library and Information Services

The library provides the OAG's staff with a full range of traditional library services, research support, electronic document delivery, and professional information consultation services.





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Digitization Unit

Established on July 08, 2021, the Digitization Unit is tasked with enhancing operational efficiency, improving data accessibility, and supporting the OAG's initiatives through the adoption of advanced digital technologies. Its primary role is to strengthen the OAG's overall digital infrastructure, thereby increasing capacity and operational efficiency. This is intended to reduce service delivery delays and ultimately improve the ease of doing business with the OAG.

Vacation and After School Centre (VASC)

The Vacation and After School Centre was established to support employees who are parents or guardians by offering supervised care for children aged three (3) to fourteen (14) years.

Care is provided:

- Before and after regular school hours;
- During school vacation periods; and
- On unscheduled school closure days or when a child is unable to attend school (excluding cases of illness).

FUNCTIONS OF THE STATUTORY BOARDS AND OTHER BODIES OF THE OFFICE OF THE ATTORNEY GENERAL

Anti-Corruption Investigation Bureau

The Anti-Corruption Investigations Bureau (ACIB) has its genesis as the Special Investigations Unit (SIU), a sub-unit of the Criminal Investigations Department (CID), which was established in 1997 to investigate the findings of a Commission of Enquiry into the Functioning of the Judiciary.

The ACIB is a Unit of the Trinidad and Tobago Police Service that is responsible for the investigation, apprehension and prosecution of all offenders into reports/allegations of Corruption made against Government Officials, Public Officers, Police Officers, Public and Statutory Bodies. The ACIB aims to reduce corruption within Trinidad and Tobago through sensitization and awareness programs, training of staff, collaboration with other agencies and prosecution of offenders to create a deterrent for potential offenders.

Central Authority (CAU)

The Central Authority Unit was established under the Mutual Assistance in Criminal Matters Act, Chap. 11:24, and serves as the designated authority for issuing, receiving, and executing Mutual Legal Assistance (MLA) requests.

Assistance provided under the Act includes, but is not limited to:

- Obtaining evidence, records, or documents for use in the requesting country;
- Locating or identifying persons;
- Conducting searches and seizures;
- Arranging attendance of persons in the requesting country to give evidence or assist investigations;
- Temporary transfer of detained persons to testify or assist;





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- Service of judicial documents;
- Identifying and tracing property derived from serious offences;
- Enforcing foreign confiscation, forfeiture, pecuniary penalty, and restraint orders; and
- Obtaining domestic restraining orders.

The CAU is also responsible for asset-sharing arrangements involving confiscated or forfeited property, negotiating MLA treaties and international cooperation agreements, and assisting the Attorney General in fulfilling obligations under the International War Crimes Tribunals Act, Chap. 11:23, including cooperation with the International Criminal Tribunal for the former Yugoslavia (ICTY) and the International Criminal Tribunal for Rwanda (ICTR).

Law Reform Commission

Established by the Law Reform Act, Chap. 3:04, the Commission is mandated under Section 4 to keep under constant review all laws applicable to Trinidad and Tobago with a view to their systematic development and reform. This includes eliminating anomalies, repealing obsolete enactments, reducing the number of separate laws, and simplifying and modernising the law.

Specific functions include:

- Receiving and considering suggestions for law reform from judges, public officials, lawyers, and the public;
- Examining proposals referred by the Attorney General or recommended by legal associations and learned bodies;
- Preparing and submitting programmes for law examination and reform to the Attorney General;
- Undertaking, pursuant to the Attorney General's recommendations, the formulation of draft Bills;
- Examining particular branches of the law and formulating reform proposals (by draft Bills or otherwise);
- Providing advice and information to government ministries, departments, and statutory authorities on proposed legal reforms; and
- Researching the legal systems of other countries where relevant to its functions.

National Biosafety

Responsibility for National Biosafety has been assigned to the OAG. Previously, decisions regarding the import and export of genetically modified organisms (GMOs) were managed by the OAG. The OAG continues to oversee relevant legislative reforms.

The National Biosafety Policy of Trinidad and Tobago, last updated in 2016, was developed in alignment with international obligations, including the Cartagena Protocol on Biosafety (CPB) to the Convention on Biological Diversity.

The policy aims to:

1. Ensure that products of modern biotechnology, including GMOs, do not pose unacceptable risks to human, animal, or plant health or to the environment;
2. Provide an enabling environment for biotechnology development by carefully managing the interface between technology and society;
3. Safeguard the environment and human, animal, and plant health at the highest safety standards without unduly restricting biotechnology development or trade;
4. Prevent perceived or actual conflicts of interest from hindering policy development, implementation, or infringing on human rights.

The overarching objective of this ministerial assignment is to promote the conservation and sustainable use of the country's biological resources while integrating biodiversity considerations into national socio-economic development planning.

Strategic Services Agency(SSA)

The Strategic Services Agency is a premier national intelligence and security agency established under the Strategic Services Agency Act, Chap. 15:06, to combat serious crime and illicit drug trafficking.

Its core functions are:



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- Centralizing Information: Centralise intelligence and act as the national hub for information that assists in detecting and preventing serious crime;
- Strategic Intelligence Development: Develop and recommend national policy on combating illicit drug trafficking and related criminal activities;
- Crime Prevention: Prepare and disseminate strategies for crime prevention; and
- Intelligence Support: Provide analytical intelligence support to law-enforcement operational units and coordinate with international counterpart agencies.

EFFECTS OF THE FUNCTIONS OF THE OFFICE OF THE ATTORNEY GENERAL ON MEMBERS OF THE PUBLIC

The work of the OAG directly impacts the holistic development of Trinidad and Tobago through the promotion of the rule of law at all levels of society.
